# Victoria Police Department Change of Command Event August 28, 2025

#### **Financial and Operational Summary**

The Victoria Police proudly hosted a momentous Change of Command ceremony on August 28, 2025, celebrating the distinguished career of Retired Chief Del Manak and welcoming Chief Fiona Wilson as the first female chief in the Department's history!

Held at Government House (1401 Rockland Avenue), the event brought together approximately 300 guests, including esteemed leaders from across British Columbia's policing community, representatives from local governments and organizations, and valued dignitaries. We were deeply honored by the presence and blessing offered by the Songhees Nation and were captivated by a stunning performance from the Lekwungen Dancers alongside the exceptional vocal talents of local performer Stephanie Greaves.

The ceremony underscored a pivotal moment for the Victoria Police Department and provided valuable opportunity to strengthen connections with our partners and stakeholders. To ensure accessibility for VicPD staff, a shuttle service was provided between the Victoria Police Department and Government House, and a live stream was expertly captured by an on-site videographer for those unable to attend in person.

This event truly marked a new chapter for the Victoria Police Department and reinforced our commitment to serving and connecting with the diverse communities we proudly protect. This table and accompanying summary provide a transparent overview of associated financial and operational details:

#### **Financial Summary:**

As detailed in the above table, the total costs associated with the Change of Command ceremony amounted to \$22,014.72. This encompasses all venue, catering and logistical

expenses. Within this total, two honorariums, totaling \$600.00, were provided in recognition of the exceptional performance services provided at the ceremony. There are no receipts available for these payments.

Payments to Wilson's Transportation and Government House were processed according to established procedures. While original receipts are not available, comprehensive documentation in the form of screenshots detailing each line item from the VicPD reconciliation software has been provided for review.

#### **Operational Summary:**

The event hosted approximately 300 attendees and required dedicated staffing to ensure a seamless and memorable experience. Staffing totals reflect only those personnel who were specifically assigned to the Change of Command Ceremony beyond their regularly scheduled duties on August 28, 2025. This ensures accurate reporting of the event's incremental operational impact.

Chief Constable Del Manak is retiring after a distinguished 35-year policing career, including 32 years with the Victoria Police Department and the last 9.5 years as Chief. Born and raised in Victoria, he is the first South Asian Chief in VicPD's 167-year history and has been a respected role model and community leader, engaging vouth and inspiring the next generation of leaders.

Throughout his career, Chief Manak held key roles in Patrol, Traffic, and as a School Liaison Officer. He created B.C.'s first Integrated Road Safety Unit, now a provincial model, and as Chief, introduced innovative programs such as the Co-Response Team, a Cybercrime unit, and the 'Before the Badge' program to help new recruits build cultural understanding and community trust.

He strengthened relationships with Indigenous communities through work with the Aboriginal Coalition to End Homelessness, championed Special Olympics athletes, and launched NHL Street in Victoria, connecting officers with youth through sport. Internally, he championed officer wellness, expanding mental health supports and reintegration services.

Chief Manak leaves a proud legacy of community trust, innovation, and compassionate leadership.



Chief Constable Fiona Wilson brings over 26 years of distinguished policing experience. She most recently served as Deputy Chief Constable with the Vancouver Police Department, where she led the Investigation Division overseeing major crime, organized crime, gangs and drugs, cybercrime, intelligence and counter-terrorism, and other specialized areas of public safety. Earlier in her career she worked in patrol. major crime, sex crimes, professional standards, and walked the Vancouver's beat in Downtown Eastside before advancing into senior leadership roles.

An accredited Team Commander, Chief Wilson has contributed to some of the most complex investigations in British Columbia. She is nationally recognized her leadership in advancing health responses to mental and expanding crisis substance use. intervention and building partnerships support vulnerable to better individuals.

Chief Wilson is a past President of the BC Association of Chiefs of Police, cochair of the Canadian Association of Chiefs of Police Drug Advisory Committee and serves on numerous committees and boards at the local, provincial, and national level. She holds BA and MA degrees in Criminology from SFU and is a Member of the Order of Merit of the Police Forces.
